Parents' Survey 2018.

Thank you to all those parents who completed our parent survey. For the first time we used Google forms, and also provided paper copies.

We reviewed many of the questions with the aim of understanding more about your opinions to make positive changes to Maryland. Several of the questions we ask are the same each year, because we like to make sure we are *consistently providing a high standard*. You will note that I have quoted last year's figure in **blue** for this reason.

Here are the highlights:

Progress –90% of you said that that the progress your child makes at Maryland is good or excellent.

-74% **found** the reporting of achievement in percentages easy to understand.

- Many of you requested that we should report your child's progress more regularly.

-You asked for more difficult tasks, extra classes, more challenge and more 1:1 time with the teacher.

-As a result, we will be reporting your child's progress three times a year. You will be receiving an **academic progress report on Thursday 29th March**. Our teacher training will focus on challenge for all pupils in all lessons and our marking policy includes the importance of 1:1 time with pupils to assess and feedback on work. If you have any questions about this, please speak to your class teacher.

Homework –58% of parents said that there were no problems with homework. 42% of parents said 'sometimes'.

-92% of you are happy with the yellow homework book and how it communicates the tasks to complete.

-As a result we have provided the homework clinic every Tuesday, to support all parents and students

-94% of you are happy with the presentation and delivery of the monthly newsletter. 50% of you said that you would still like to trial the newsletter online.

-All of you have read our most recent Ofsted report, with some very positive comments such as 'job well done' and 'I'm happy the school is doing well'.

Reading –There was a decrease of parents reading with their child every day from **60%** last year, to 42% this year There has been an increase in the number of parents working daily from *Mental Maths 5 a day* to **82% (60%) daily** or 2-3 times a week. It is so important to keep up with reading and mental maths with your child **every day**, to ensure they can cope with the demands of the national curriculum. Little and often is the only 'painless' way to build up speed. We thank you to all those who offered to support us by reading with our pupils. We will be in touch with you soon.

Physical Exercise 72% of you said that your child exercises daily or 2-3 times a week. The government recommendation is that all primary children should exercise for 1 hour a day. As a result we are reviewing our playground activities to ensure that children are moving more energetically. We have employed a play leader for the Junior lunchtimes and employed three more Lunchtime Managers to help engage all children play during breaktimes. We will review our after school clubs provision to ensure that as many opportunities for exercise are provided to your children. Support us by taking them for a run around the park. By the end of this year we will have provided at least 20 clubs, some of which run all year, comparing very favourably with 3 outstanding schools in Newham that provide 20, 18 and 10 clubs respectively.

Technology We understand that technology is transforming all our lives. We thank you for requesting training on particular aspects of technology in our school life such as E-safety, Google Classroom and Athletics. Timings and dates for these workshops to follow. Thank you so much for the many complimentary comments we had about what you like best about our school and equally those comments that suggest how we might improve. We will work with you to make Maryland even better.

Important changes to Junior 'Eat for Free' scheme.

The local authority have informed us of some changes to the way the school gets funding to pay for Junior school meals under the 'eat for free' scheme. From the 2nd April 2018, the school will **now receive a grant** each term to cover the costs for providing junior school meals under the 'Eat for Free' scheme. **We are very pleased** this grant has been made available to all ensure all Junior pupils have a healthy and satisfying lunch.



School Closure for Local and Mayoral Elections Thursday 3rd May 2018

The school is being used by the council as a polling station on 3rd May so will be closed. There will be no afterschool or Children's Centre services that day. You may have been told that we are closing on 25th May—well, we will in fact be **OPEN** on the 25th May but **CLOSED** on Thursday 3rd May instead.

All teachers will be carrying out mini experiments with you and your children. We want to show you how important science experiments are, and how easy they can be to carry out at home. Teachers will then be discussing the science and scientist behind each experiment. The event is part of our British Science Week celebrations, children will be investigating and conducting some awe inspiring experiments in class. Due to its success, we would like to invite parents to experience all things scientific with us.



Neuroscientist study starts April 2018

Birkbeck university will be working with Maryland students on a new scientific study to investigate how children's brains handle problems. The study will **support maths and science lessons**, particularly some of the problems that children have to tackle as part of the curriculum. The aim of the study is to **investigate how children tackle tricky problems** through studying the way children respond to **online brain games**. The children will be using the 'stop and think' strategy, where a problem is introduced and children are given deliberate time to stop and think before tackling. The results will be measured in the summer term and published later as part of national research for the **Education Endowment Foundation** and the **NERF**. Children and parents have been invited to have a photograph of their brain through an MRI scan. If you would like to find out more, please contact the Year 3 and Year 5 teachers.


