#### Read with your child every day

Finding time out of a busy daily schedule to read with your child can be an uphill task indeed! However, it is a task that has to be performed because of the long-term positive impact on your child's academic achievement. Reading helps your child to develop love for books which in turn broadens their horizon. As the new academic year begins, we implore parents to spend at least 20 minutes each day either reading with or listening to their child read. It is a *routine* that contributes to a solid academic foundation for the future .

#### Reading tips:

- -when starting a new book, ask your child to read the title of the book and make a prediction about the story; better still, ask them questions about the illustrations on the front cover to gauge their understanding of what the story might be about .
- -try and ask them to recall what they have read so far and in addition, encourage them to make predictions about what will happen next in the story. Reading is a worthwhile exercise!

#### Summer orienteering event- well done Maryland!

Maryland team came 2nd in this year's summer orienteering event. A total of 20 different teams from Newham schools participated. The pupils' map reading and orienteering skills were put to the test and Maryland pupils rose to the challenge! This is our first year of taking part in this event. We look forward to being 1st next year.



#### Parents/staff association


