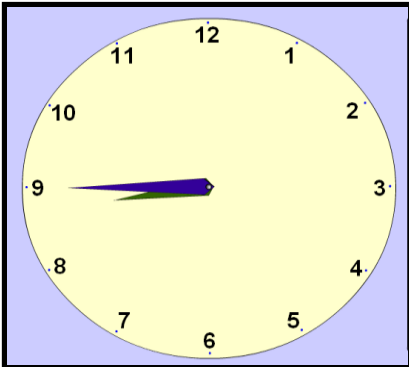
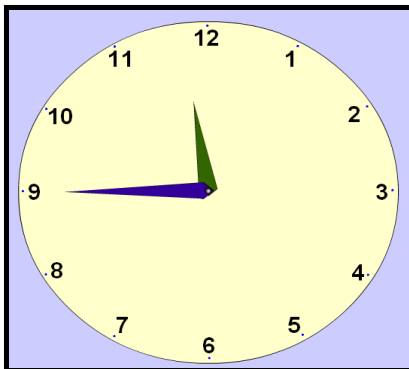


Welcome to Maryland Nursery

Now I am 3 years old, I am big enough to go to Maryland Nursery.

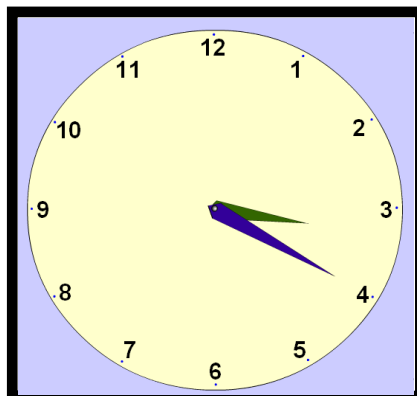
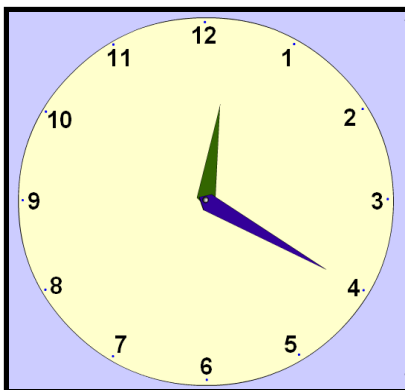


I am going to go every morning.

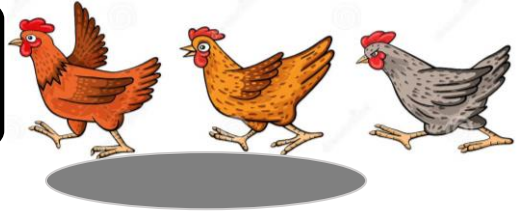

I must not wear jewellery or bring my own toys into school (unless it is a Toy Day).

I will need to bring a book bag so I can take home my reading book, my wonderful pictures, work and important letters.

I should probably have velcro shoes too. Laces are a bit tricky!



I will wear my school uniform. If I am in Nursery I can wear tracksuit bottoms like these it will make it easier for me to go to the toilet and to get dressed by myself.



If I am in Reception I can wear trousers and will need a PE Kit too - shorts, t-shirt, plimsolls and tracksuit bottoms for when it's cold. I will bring my PE kit to school on Monday and take it home on Friday to be washed.



We do lots of our learning outside so I will need a coat, hat, scarf and gloves if it is cold.





When I start Nursery, I will need to be grown up and be able to go to the toilet by myself which means :

- I can pull down my clothes by myself
- use the toilet paper
- Flush the toilet
- wash my hands - all by myself

At Nursery my teacher will give me a drink of milk each day to help me be healthy. I will need to eat some fruit & vegetables each day at home too. When I get to Reception I will no longer be given milk by the teacher but instead I will be given a delicious piece of fruit to enjoy at break time.

I'm sure that will never happen!





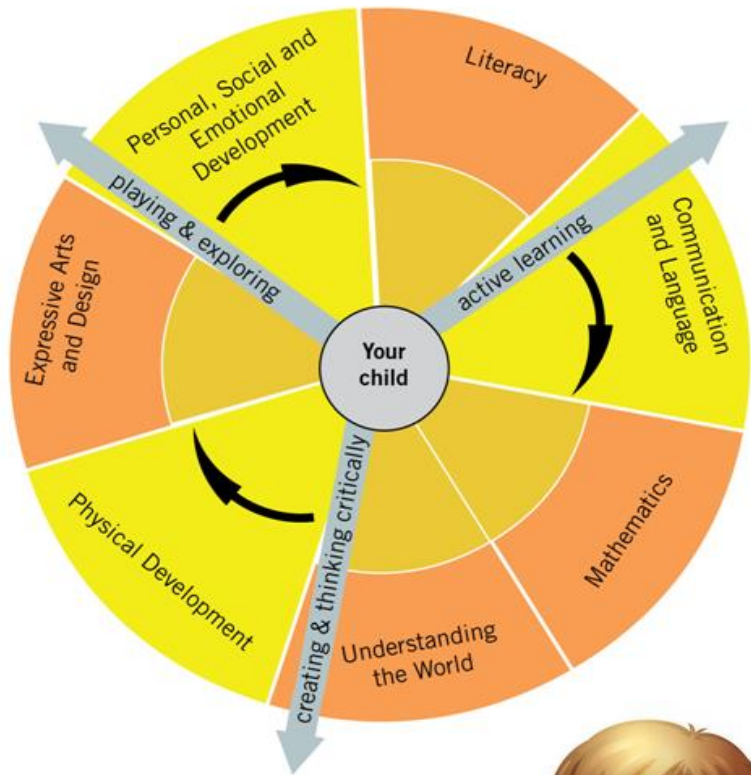
What will I do in my new class?



There are 7 areas of learning. The adults will look at what we learn, but most importantly, how we learn. Have a look at the picture below.



There are 3 'prime areas' (the yellow ones) and they are super-duper important as they help us to be able to do everything else.



There are also 4 'specific areas' (the orange ones).



So, sometimes I will work with an adult and sometimes I will work by myself or with all of my friends.

The same areas of learning are planned for in Nursery and Reception but at different levels of development/challenge. You can find out more on the Maryland website.

But I heard that you get to just play all of the time ...



It might look like that, but our teachers are giving us time to apply what we have learned in our focus activities. They are going to observe how we learn.

Yes, they change the resources and activities depending on what they observe us doing. You can see photographs of things we do in our books.



The teachers show us where all of the resources are and how to use them when we have focus activities, so that when we have choosing time, we can decide what we want to do and how we want to do it. This helps us to be independent learners.



They also teach us how to be independent and tidy everything away by ourselves. In Reception, after the first term, there are more focussed activities planned to ensure that we are prepared for more formal learning that takes place in Year 1.
