2. PROGRESS AND IMPACT TO DATE


- a. Ofsted visited in February this year. Ofsted were very impressed by the students' understanding and in-depth knowledge that children had about artists and periods in art history, and of their analytical analysis of artwork using the elements of art as a guide. However, a next step would be to help children to better verbally articulate the skills they
 - i. Ofsted commented that subject leaders were knowledgeable and ambitious with their curriculum, showing great expertise.
 - ii. From the Ofsted report 2023: 'Leaders have put a well structured curriculum in place that meets the requirements of the national curriculum. They have identified what they want pupils to learn and
 - broken this down into logical steps. For example, pupils in Year 5 make detailed printing blocks inspired by William Morris because they have been given the opportunity to analyse and evaluate his artwork and then plan careful designs.'

had learnt whilst making their final art pieces and products.

- iii. The Medium Term Plan showed all areas of national curriculum, and the Maryland curriculum is well sequenced and ambitious, with leaders continuously reviewing the curriculum.
- iv. Ofsted praised in their report the provision for pupils' personal development as being exemplary. For example, leaders host an annual art exhibition showcasing pupils' work, which is open to the public.
- v. Pupils spoke about how much they enjoyed art, design and technology.
- Maryland has invested in a subscription to Kapow to assist further with Art and Design Curriculum development and strengthen teachers confidence in teaching art skills.
- c. Art, Design and Technology is regularly being reviewed, refined and improved. We are ensuring equality is embedded into the Maryland curriculum through the study of a diverse range of artists, craft makers and designers, in every topic.
- d. Children's Art Week 2023 will be celebrated June 29 July 19 with fun art challenges to do during lunchtimes.
- e. Summer monitoring of learning through book looks and learning walks has shown good progression in children developing and creating in their sketchbooks to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas. These books will be carried over to next year so children can go back and reflect on the skills they have previously learnt.







f. Children's artwork is displayed and celebrated throughout the school and is a major pride factor for Maryland when touring our guests around the school.
