

IMPACT REPORT TO MARYLAND PRIMARY SCHOOL GOVERNORS  
SUBJECT: PE and OHSL TERM: Autumn 2023  
SUBJECT LEADER: Mr Hoque

1. KEY POINTS FROM SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT PLAN (SDP)

- To continue to plan for equipment and activities that will engage SEND pupils.
- To promote the HAES curriculum and attitudes towards Health At Every Size (HAES).
- To ensure all children have the opportunity to remain active and engage closely with PE. To provide children with access to a wide-ranging variety of sports.
- Train Lunchtime Managers in different activities, to engage children in meaningful play in the playground to reduce lunchtime warnings.
- ECT team teaching with expert coach(es). (Early Career Teachers)
- After-school clubs continue with martial arts club, and basketball club and consult with Newham SSP to explore what else they can offer.
- To develop and refine pupils' sports skills whilst raising the profile of Sport and activities within the school.
- To meet the national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety.
- To increase the use of the in-school climbing apparatus
- To continue to provide opportunities for children to participate in competitive sports. (School Games Mark).



2. PROGRESS AND IMPACT TO DATE

- Sporting achievements are recognised and celebrated in assemblies, in the school newsletter and on the website. Maryland has achieved the gold award from the 'School Games Mark'. (5 years running)
- We now have a qualified sports playleader leading games in the junior playground during lunchtimes along with the 30, Year 5 play leaders.
- Lunchtime managers along with 30 Year 5 pupils have received training in leading games and increasing participation in games of reluctant pupils and those pupils who have transitioned into the Reception in the KS2 and KS1 playgrounds
- A targeted group of Year 5 and Year 6 play leaders have been allocated in the KS1 playground to help manage and improve the overall quality of play.
- The climbing apparatus has been developed into the Gymnastics curriculum in order to increase the use of apparatus from Reception to Year 6
- A member of the Newham SSP team will be team teaching with one of our ECTs (Year 4 teacher and Year 1 teacher) to increase their confidence, knowledge and skill in delivering the PE curriculum,.
- An audit of all PE equipment within the school has been completed to ensure that all PE lessons are sufficiently resourced together with a variety of equipment being available during break times.
- Regular assemblies keep the children updated on changes to rotas in the playground and upcoming competitions or new clubs.
- The year 6 residential trip took place in September promoting physical activity, good health, teamwork and independence. The children had a fantastic time and developed independence alongside some excellent life skills.
- Swimming takes place in the summer term with the year 6 pupils participating. Please see the comparison of results below.
